MBSEF Drug and Alcohol Policy**

The physical and mental demands of competitive skiing and snowboarding are not compatible with the use of illegal drugs, alcohol and tobacco. Substance abuse not only affects your performance but also jeopardizes the safety and well being of others.

Mt. Bachelor Sports Education Foundation endorses a firm policy against the illegal use of drugs, alcohol and tobacco. As a condition of participation in any MBSEF program all athletes must agree to submit to alcohol or drug tests, if requested by MBSEF coaches or administrators. MBSEF will administer random drug tests. The test consists of an evaluation of a urine sample.

If you are randomly selected or if there is a reasonable suspicion to take a drug test, your parent will be notified, and asked to report with you to Business Health Resources, 2248 NE Division Street, Bend (or with your coach to the nearest facility if you are at an away-race) within 12 hours of the request. MBSEF will pay for the test.

Any samples which test positively for illegal drugs will be treated as a major offense. Failure to comply with the request to take a drug test will also be treated as a major offense. Refer to the Parent/Athlete Program Manual for offense consequences.

While our coaches are not trained as medical personnel or counselors, we will assist any athlete in finding the necessary professional help for substance abuse problems.
